Linamar *Helping North America out-compete the world*



Linamar is a Canadian company that manufactures precision metallic components and driveline systems for passenger and commercial vehicles, and Skyjack industrial equipment. Its North American operations include seven facilities in the U.S., 29 facilities in Canada, and four locations in Mexico. Linamar employs 19,000 skilled workers at its 45 manufacturing plants around the world and reports annual sales in excess of \$3.5 billion.

North America is home to the majority of Linamar's engineering and manufacturing operations. Linamar acquired Skyjack, a manufacturer of aerial work platforms, in 2002 and McLaren Performance Technologies in 2003.

Linamar has maintained the plant in Livonia, Michigan where McLaren Performance shares the design, development, testing and R&D of performance vehicle engines with Guelph, Ontario's Frank Hasenfratz Centre of Excellence in Manufacturing. At these facilities, state-of-the art powertrains and drivelines are tested and made into prototypes. McLaren Performance Technologies is responsible for early generation Indy 500 winners and the McLaren Mustang.
